Well, chess is all about focusing, concentrating, thinking ahead, weighting options, thinking concretely, thinking abstractly, visualizing, planning, and learning to juggle about a dozen considerations in your mind all at once. Location: Pittsburgh Chess Club, 5604 Solway St., 2nd Floor, in the Wightman Community Building.

Directions: Take the Parkway to the Squirrel Hill exit, turn left to Murray Ave, then left onto Murray and proceed straight to Solway St. (located a few blocks past Forbes Ave). Make another left onto Solway. The Chess club is at 5604 Solway (across from a playground) on the block between Negley Ave and Wightman Ave. Air-conditioned.

General: All classes meet for 6 weeks. Each class is divided between instruction and playing time. Ribbons will be awarded to top scoring players. Games are rated and US Chess Federation (USCF) membership is required.

Beginner Class - Sundays: June 20 - Aug 8 (no class 7/4 or 7/11) Time: 3:15 - 4:15 pm Cost - \$40

This class will provide your child with a better idea of what to aim for when they play. Basic goals, fundamental concepts, simple tactics and techniques are the focus. **Prerequisite: Students must know how to play.**

Adv Beginner Class - Sundays: June 20 - Aug 8 (no class 7/4 or 7/11) Time: 2:00 - 3:00 pm Cost - \$40

Recommended playing level 350-600 or permission of instructor

Solving short problems, improving endgame skills, discussion of strategic principles, and an introduction to commonly played openings along with the ideas behind them are the main topics in this class.

Intermediate Class - Sundays: June 20 - Aug 8 (no class 7/4 or 7/11) Time: 12:45 - 1:45 pm Cost - \$40

Recommended playing level 600-1000 or permission of instructor

A major goal in this class is improving the student's ability to visualize ahead and analyse positions. Classic games or carefully selected positions are introduced, and students are prompted to work through the tactics in class.

Advanced Class - Monday night class is off for the summer.

Analyzing your own games is one of the best methods to improve. Therefore, I suggest that advanced students try one of my summer camps. Camp 4, from July 12 - 16 is for players rated over 1000 up to about 1600. Another option would be Camp 8 from Aug 9 to Aug 13, which is for players from 850 to 1250. Details on my website.
